JR and Diane serenaded us with some great Country Music during the social hour before dinner. Several couples even got up and danced. It was a fun evening with friends!










The Central Arizona Satellite of the Superstition Mountain Chapter of MOAA has been busy during the summer with plans for the upcoming year.

In August, CAS joined the Greater Casa Grande Chamber of Commerce. Our membership as a nonprofit service organization has already gained attention by other members of the Casa Grande Chamber, who have voiced interest in supporting MOAA and CAS goals of supporting active, reserve, national guard and former military personnel.

During the Chamber's August "Business After-Hours Mixer," Harold Fales and Norman Poole were presented with CAS's new membership plaque and they were introduced to the Chamber's members. The event was hosted by the Casa Grande Banner Regional Hospital.

Mr. Fales had the opportunity to discuss how CAS, as a part of MOAA and the Superstition Mountain Chapter, are serving our local military, veterans, and Reserve Officer Training Corps' detachments. He explained that recent reductions in funding have created financial challenges for the Junior ROTC detachments at Casa Grande Union, Casa Grande Val Vista, and Coolidge High Schools. Mr. Fales expressed the hope that CAS could help address those issues. CAS is already preparing for a golf tournament in March of next year at the course in Arizona City to help sponsor and support the JROTC program.

In addition to the Casa Grande Chamber activities, Mr. Fales and Mr. Poole also attended the Superstition Mountain Chapter Board of Director's meeting at Dobson Ranch in Mesa on September 11th. The board provided the representatives of CAS with guidance and support for the upcoming activities to help support the three JROTC units.

A Request for books



The Soto Cano Library has been on our mailing list for a while. This week we received an email from our contact there. He writes: "The multiple storms have roughly 50% of our active personnel here in Latin America operating in Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Given the lack of power there, we are hoping to send some books that way. It may well be that this mission will go on for a while and of course, we'd be grateful for any mixed fiction and nonfiction books you could send our way. We will load them onto supply aircraft and give these soldiers, sailors and airmen something to do during their downtime. Having just returned from PR, I can tell you that it is much worse than it looks on television. We are concentrating on trying to serve the most at risk, including children and the elderly. It is extremely discouraging. Thank you in advance for your support."

Looking at Tomorrows Leaders

This is a short article Peggy Allen wrote about her grandson, Nathan. He is the 5th Generation of the family who has volunteered in support of Veterans issues and projects!



Nathan Griswold is the grandson of Arlan and Peggy Allen, SMC members. When Nathan entered his Freshman year at Basha High School, he was tasked with deciding the subject of his Senior Project. The Senior Project is a project the student works on beginning the Freshman year and must be completed prior to graduation. Nathan's choice was "Homeless Vets in the Valley. He spent numerous hours researching the number of homeless veterans in the valley, causes and issues leading to a veteran being homeless, resources and assets available to assist the homeless and various local outreach programs for the veterans. After reviewing the collected materials, Nathan chose the Community Resource and Referral Center, 1500 E Thomas Rd., Phoenix, AZ., as a location for him to provide assistance to a few homeless veterans by donating Walmart "Thank You" Gift Cards. He presented these gift cards on Friday, September 22nd.

The summation of his data collection and efforts will be presented in a Power Point Presentation to his Civics Class at the end of the year.

Final Push for Defense Bill

As the defense bill heads to conference committee, your earned benefits are at stake. Congress will decide on the military pay raise, TRICARE pharmacy fees, and significant changes to the military health system.

Prevent Steep TRICARE Fee Hikes

The FY2018 national defense authorization bill negotiations are underway. The Senate's budget request includes large increases to TRICARE fees across the board. These fee increases are a direct result of the repeal of the 2017 National Defense Authorizations grand-fathering clause. The intention of the grand-fathering was to keep fees where they currently are for beneficiaries in the service prior to 1 January 2018.

Compensation is Crucial to Recruitment and Retention

The president has requested DoD commence with the 13th Quadrennial Review of Military Compensation (QRMC) to assess the adequacy of military compensation and, essentially, decide if a salary system would be more effective for recruiting and retention.
