President's Comments



Greetings from your President. We are well into a New Year and it is time to get some things started. I had previously mentioned I would like to open a conversation about starting something new for our Veterans. Although our Auxiliary is heading up a great project with Hygiene Kits for our less fortunate homeless Veterans, (And it is very well received by the Veterans Center), I think we could possibly engage in another project. At our February Board meeting we will be discussing this further.

This past week I attended a committee hearing at the State senate where a Bill was heard by the Senate Finance Committee. This bill addresses reducing the tax on military retiree's retired pay. It is currently \$2,500 and will progress to \$10,000 by 2020. The Bill passed but it was a close 4-3 vote. This is the first of many steps this Bill must pass through. There are many skeptics in our legislature about why this tax reduction is necessary. Although there are about 600,000 veterans in the State, it would affect about 56,000 who actually receive retired pay.

I encourage ALL of you who think this Bill is good for retirees to contact your State Legislators. The Governor has endorsed this bill and would like to see it passed. We will keep you informed as this bill moves through the various committees.

The Board will meet February 12th, and our dinner meeting is scheduled for February 18th. See you all there.

Legislative update from MOAA National "Take Action" January 30, 2018

These important issues require your immediate attention. Send your elected officials a MOAA-suggested message today.

Make the right choices on pay raises, health care fees, and more

The defense bill carries many of MOAA's most pressing priorities every year, so this is likely the last chance to draw the line in the sand on these big issues until next year. As we continue to put the pressure on the conferees over a long list of issues, we remain steadfast in our positions on a handful of key issues like pay. TRICARE and more.

Prevent Steep TRICARE Fee Hikes

The FY2018 national defense authorization bill negotiations are underway. The Senate's budget request includes large increases to TRICARE fees across the board. These fee increases are a direct result of the repeal of the 2017 National Defense Authorizations grand-fathering clause. The intention of the grandfathering was to keep fees where they currently are for beneficiaries in the service prior to 1 January 2018.

Compensation is Crucial to Recruitment and Retention

The president has requested DoD commence with the 13th Quadrennial Review of Military Compensation (QRMC) to assess the adequacy of military compensation and, essentially, decide if a salary system would be more effective for recruiting and retention.

Fully fund defense for FY18

"Just pass the budget, give us some certainty. Another continuing resolution that would keep spending at current levels is not an effective way for us to manage the money and to do the things we need to do to regain our readiness and prepare." — Marine Commandant Gen. Robert Neller in recent testimony before Congress.

Veterans' Diseases Associated with Agent Orange

VA assumes that certain diseases can be related to a Veteran's qualifying military service. We call these "presumptive diseases." VA has recognized certain cancers and other health problems as presumptive diseases associated with exposure to Agent Orange or other herbicides during military service. Veterans and their survivors may be eligible for benefits for these diseases.

- AL Amyloidosis: A rare disease caused when an abnormal protein, amyloid, enters tissues or organs
- Chronic B-cell Leukemias: A type of cancer which affects white blood cells
- Chloracne (or similar acneform disease): A skin condition that occurs soon after exposure to chemicals and looks like common forms of acne seen in teenagers. Under VA's rating regulations, it must be at least 10 percent disabling within one year of exposure to herbicides.
- **Diabetes Mellitus Type 2**: A disease characterized by high blood sugar levels resulting from the body's inability to respond properly to the hormone insulin
- **Hodgkin's Disease**: A malignant lymphoma (cancer) characterized by progressive enlargement of the lymph nodes, liver, and spleen, and by progressive anemia
- Ischemic Heart Disease: A disease characterized by a reduced supply of blood to the heart, that leads to chest pain
- Multiple Myeloma: A cancer of plasma cells, a type of white blood cell in bone marrow
- Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma: A group of cancers that affect the lymph glands and other lymphatic tissue
- Parkinson's Disease: A progressive disorder of the nervous system that affects muscle movement
- **Peripheral Neuropathy, Early-Onset**: A nervous system condition that causes numbness, tingling, and motor weakness. Under VA's rating regulations, it must be at least 10 percent disabling within one year of herbicide exposure.
- **Porphyria Cutanea Tarda**: A disorder characterized by liver dysfunction and by thinning and blistering of the skin in sun-exposed areas. Under VA's rating regulations, it must be at least 10 percent disabling within one year of exposure to herbicides.
- Prostate Cancer: Cancer of the prostate; one of the most common cancers among men
- Respiratory Cancers (includes lung cancer): Cancers of the lung, larynx, trachea, and bronchus
- Soft Tissue Sarcomas (other than osteosarcoma, chondrosarcoma, Kaposi's sarcoma, or mesothelioma): A
 group of different types of cancers in body tissues such as muscle, fat, blood and lymph vessels, and connective
 tissues
