Transition Coordinator **James Austin** **Need A Job?**

Veterans should go to Google.com citing their Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) or Airforce Specialty Code (AFSC) for daily listing of job openings nationwide and internationally.

Airobotics, an Israeli drone firm, is immediately bringing 80 jobs to Scottsdale, Arizona over the next year according to its CEO Ran Krauss. Airobotics uses its drones to collect aerial data and hopes to replace standard piloted services by providing cheaper drone alternatives that are more accurate and readily available. Their drones called "Optimus" primarily serve the mining, seaport and oil and gas industries and can fly for 30 minutes while carrying up to a 1-kilogram payload. They are fully automatic, capable of taking off and landing on their own and can benefit from Scottsdale's positive business climate and world-class quality of life. Optimum flying weather has resulted in Airobotics selecting Scottsdale for its North American Headquarters servicing offices in Australia, Chile, and New Calendonia. The Scottsdale office when fully manned hopes to have 80-200 employees by the end of 2019. Veterans are highly encouraged to seek out the various positions offered by this dynamic new industry on the Arizona landscape.

An ad in the Arizona Republic Newspaper dated 28 October 2018 read: "Now you can search "jobs for veterans "and enter your MOS code to find civilian jobs that match your skills." Air Force designation of AFSC would also be included in the MOS designation. It highlights Google in multi-color and illustrates the computer printout "jobs for veterans along with Google Search and I'm Feeling Lucky" on the newspaper layout.

Mattis: Cyber Command is Working to Prevent Midterm Election Tampering

Fresh from meetings in Beijing and the Middle East, Defense Secretary James Mattis visited the U.S. Institute of Peace in Washington, D.C. on Tuesday to offer his perspective on the U.S. defense strategy. Mattis, whose public speaking engagements have been rare of late, spent an hour sharing his thoughts on topics ranging from the space force to the war in Afghanistan.

Here are some key takeaways from the Institute's discussion with Mattis:

On preventing election tampering: Mattis said the top priority of U.S. Cyber Command is maintaining the security of the upcoming election on Nov. 6. The U.S. military can't do it alone, he said, but it has an obligation to protect the country. The military tracks hacking efforts and works with the FBI to alert internet providers, he said. "It's an all hands-on-deck effort to keep our democratic process free and unencumbered," he said. "When it comes to protecting the country in this day and age, it's not just about guns and ships and that sort of thing. This is a powerful weapon in the hands of people that know what they're doing, and our adversaries do."

On space: Mattis said the U.S. must be prepared to not only defend its assets in space but go on the offensive. Specifically, we must be able to defend satellites used for military intelligence, navigation, communication, commerce and banking. "We're going to have to defend what we have," he said. "But we're going to have to be prepared to use offensive weapons in space. This is not an area we want to be second place in."

On Afghanistan: Mattis defended the ongoing effort in Afghanistan to support Afghan Security Forces with the train, advise and assist mission. "We never thought in the military this was going to be an easy job," Mattis said. "If we want to protect ourselves ... it's worthwhile."

On allies: The United States must maintain its relationships with its allies, Mattis said. "One of the reasons we need allies in this world - nations with allies thrive, Nations without them die," he said. "We can work together with them and get a much better return on that effort. No one nation on its own can defend itself."

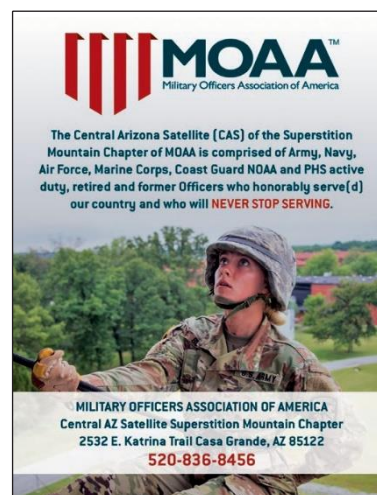

The satellite has been busy, attending a number of activities in the area, including the Casa Grande Chamber of Commerce's "Before Business" and "After Hours" meetings, in an attempt to contact potential members for CAS. In addition, CAS has inserted a full color ¼ page ad in the Chamber's 2019 Business Directory and Community Guide, which is attached. CAS also plans on advertising in the Casa Grande Dispatch (the daily newspaper) prior to each of its monthly luncheon meetings.

CAS also received a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) from SMC signed by the SMC President, MG Rataczak, outlining conditions, goals and activities to be mutually met between the two organizations. A

lengthy discussion at the September meeting ensued, concerning the MOA. Ed Mangan agreed to represent CAS at the SMC board of directors' meetings for CAS, based on the fact that he will already attend as past President of SMC and regularly attends the CAS monthly meetings. Other provisions outlined in the MOA were also discussed, including requirements for financial expenditures and activities, membership growth target dates, etc.

We are hopeful with the actions being pursued and support from both MOAA national and SMC, that the Satellite will continue viable membership growth and service to the Central Arizona communities as well as MOAA and SMC.

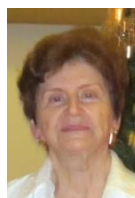
