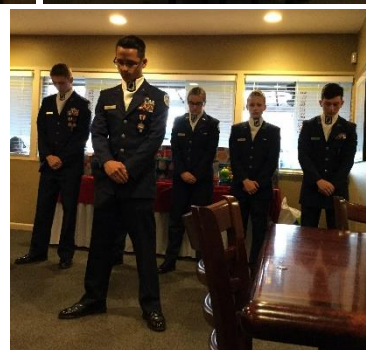
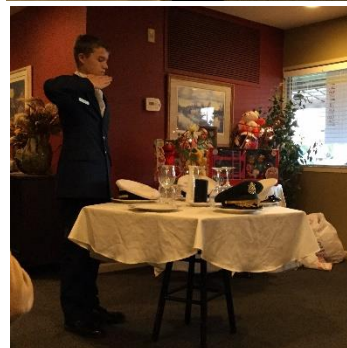

This poignant ceremony is conducted with a script, solemn members marching in slow ceremonial cadence who represent the service(s) to place a hat at an austere table (the Battle Hymn of the Republic is softly played). The ceremony sends a message of commitment to all, especially to those still serving, that our POW/MIA and KIA that they will not be forgotten...the ceremony is concluded with Taps and the detail briskly marches away.

The final FY 2018 COLA, which takes effect Jan. 1, 2019, is 2.8 percent, **matching MOAA's prediction**. For context, this means that for every \$1,000 you currently receive in retired pay, you will receive \$28 more starting Jan. 1, 2019.

The calculation is made by comparing the average CPI from July through September of the current fiscal year to the average for the same months of the year prior. Remember, active duty pay raises are calculated differently.

These important issues require your immediate attention. Send your elected officials a MOAA-suggested message today.

Time is running out on three important issues

Congress is running out of time to pass critical legislation for servicemembers and their families. There are fewer than 16 legislative working days to pass standalone bills that would:

Protect Servicemembers from Predatory Lenders

Send the White House a letter urging the administration to reconsider proposals to relax enforcement of the Military Lending Act.

Act now to end the widow's tax

Current federal law requires survivors of deceased military members to forfeit part or all of their Survivor Benefit Plan

(SBP) annuity when they are awarded VA Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC). This loss of any portion of the SBP annuity is known as the "widows' tax."

- **Be Cautious with Compensation Reform**

In a 2015 report, the Military Compensation and Modernization Commission noted modernization might benefit individual compensation programs, but "the overall structure of the current compensation system is fundamentally sound and does not require sweeping overhaul." The commission also recommended keeping the basic pay table in its current form and continuing the basic allowances for housing and subsistence (BAH and BAS).

Happy Holidays to all. We will shortly begin another year of our Chapter's support to local high schools' and colleges' ROTC training programs. For 2019 we will support the JROTC programs at 21 East Valley High Schools and four ROTC programs at Arizona State University. This year we have added the JROTC program at Poston Butte High School in San Tan, AZ. Poston Butte is a USAF sponsored program.

For those unfamiliar with our program, our chapter provides each JROTC senior military instructor with three awards that are given during the school's annual recognition ceremony. The awards are: the MOAA Medal given for demonstrated leadership; a US Flag, that has been flown over our nation's capital, for demonstrated patriotism; and a \$100 impact award to be given by the instructor to a deserving cadet of his/her choice. For the ASU ROTC program the chapter provides the MOAA Medal to each of the four cadet programs.

The school's awards programs are conducted near the end of the school year in April and May. Chapter members typically present the awards in person during these ceremonies. On page 9 of this newsletter is a spreadsheet of our program with a row for each supported school and entry blocks for presenters and sponsors. You will see that a number of chapter members have already committed as a sponsor and/or presenter. If you are interested in sponsoring or presenting this year, I will have a signup sheet available at each chapter function or you can contact me directly by phone or e-mail to discuss the program.

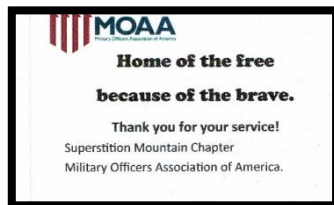

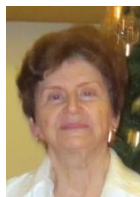
