President John Bushko presented Glynn with one of our Chapter coins, as he thanked him for a great performance!


Our 50/50 raffle was hosted by Judy Bushko. Bill Baran, our newest member won the pot! Most of our raffles will now be 50/50 raffles.

#### Do Not Raise TRICARE Fees

Yes, your TRICARE fees and cost shares are once again in the crosshairs. The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) recently published their annual list of budget strategies with options for policymakers to consider as they begin the budgeting process for next year. And as we know, they will be looking to increase revenue any way they can get it - so knowing in advance the areas they are going to focus on is a powerful offense for MOAA.

#### Protect Gold Star spouses during future shutdowns

Under current law, Gold Star spouses receiving benefits from the Department of Defense are protected from interruptions in payments during a government shutdown. But because Coast Guard paychecks come from the Department of Homeland Security, these survivors are still at risk.

#### Military pay and benefits matter

Sustain military pay increases comparable to the growth in civilian sector wages and salaries. The employment cost index (ECI) was 3.1 percent in 2018, and our active duty servicemembers deserve the full pay raise in the FY2020 NDAA.

Greetings,

Several issues to cover this month.

Many of our chapter members are not registered with or receiving care from the Veterans Administration Health Services. The usual reason is that you already have Medicare/Tricare for Life benefits; or coverage from previous employment or spousal benefits. Not being enrolled may not be in your best interest.

As we age our health status changes. Cardiovascular problems, diabetes, cancer, etc. may develop. Although these problems occur in non veterans, it is important for veterans with helth issues, that served in Vietnam or the waters surrounding Vietnam that might have been exposed to Agent Orange to register with the Veterans Administration Health Services. Many of these health issues are presumptive to exposure to this chemical.

Unless you have voluntarily in rolled in the SBP (Survivors Benefit Program) the governments obligation ends with your death. (exception is Social Security). However, if you should die from a disease determined by the VA to be caused by your military service, your survivors will receive DIC (Death and Indemnity Compensation). This is a tax-free sum to your survivors. This was set by congress and is approximately \$1300 a month. There are a couple of other ways, but this is most important.

In addition, if you have a disability rating from the VA, the amount is subtracted from your retired pay for tax purposes. For example; If your retired pay is \$1000 a month and your disability is \$400 a month, only \$600 a month is subject to income tax. Something to think about

A new Board of Directors has begun their duties on your behalf, and we have new and welcome faces at our meetings.

For both new and old (not age) members, over the next several months I would again like to cover some of the items which you should have in your "go" file which you can have access to in case of the loss of your veteran.

- Have a copy of your DD214. For your survivors, this is the key to the kingdom so to speak. This document will be used to obtain VA benefits, to make military pay notifications, make Social Security claims and to assist funeral homes with arrangements (more on this later).
- Have a copy of your marriage license and if applicable, any divorce/annulment papers. Some benefits are dependent on the length of the marriage as it overlaps with military service time.

This a start, more to come.

#### A few quotes from notable ROTC graduates

General Colin Powell: ""the armed forces might get a youngster more inclined to enlist as a result of Junior ROTC," but added that "Inner-city kids, many from broken homes, found stability and role models in Junior ROTC."

General Michael E. Ryan, Chief of Staff of the United States Air Force, "almost 50 percent of the folks that go out of the Air Force Junior ROTC go into one of the Services by enlisting or going to ROTC or going to one of the academies."
