This poignant ceremony is conducted with a script, solemn members marching in slow ceremonial cadence who represent the service(s) to place a hat at an austere table (the Battle Hymn of the Republic is softly played). The ceremony sends a message of commitment to all, especially to those still serving, that our POW/MIA and KIA that they will not be forgotten...the ceremony is concluded with Taps and the detail briskly marches away.



Legislative Dave Rataczak



Well, it looks like the government won't be shutting down for a little while at least. President Trump signed the Spending Bill to keep things

going until December 20th.

The following information is from the MOAA National website December 3, 2019.

Although the calendar year is changing, you can expect to see some of the same goals from MOAA's advocacy team year over year.

"In 2019, MOAA Government Relations will engage the 116th Congress early and often on issues of greatest importance to our members, the men and women in our uniformed services, their families, and their survivors," says Col. Dan Merry, USAF (Ret), vice president of Government Relations. "As military experience among members of Congress has declined over the years, with just over 17 percent having experience in uniform at the onset of 2019, these goals are instrumental to our efforts to inform and influence members of Congress and their staffs."

The split political power between the two houses promises to bring new challenges and opportunities. Those cannot be addressed until the new Congress is sworn in and committee assignments have been finalized.

However, a first step in any new congressional session is to reintroduce legislation that was not passed in the previous legislative cycle. MOAA's national and grassroots supporters will work directly with members of Congress to ensure our interests are properly represented by proposed and reintroduced legislation.

Some of National MOAA's 2019 goals:

- End concurrent receipt penalties for military retirees.
- Achieve equity of benefits for Guard and Reserve members with their active duty counterparts.

- Strengthen DoD-VA collaboration and services to support wounded warriors and an expanding population of women veterans.
- Ensure timely access to service-earned VA benefits.
- Ensure timely access to service-earned VA benefits.
- Protect military and veteran family support programs and policies
