Greetings all:

Those of you who were unable to attend Saturday's luncheon missed a most informative program arranged by John Bushko, and presented by staff of Arizona Life Hospice. Local data shows the average stay in hospice where you are eligible for care under Medicare of 6 mos. Because of your veteran status, other benefits also kick in thru the VA. ALH has a full-time veterans advocate to assist with that benefit.

ALH has a type of screening quiz to help determine if hospice may be appropriate. And remember, eligibility is not limited to medical issues, but mental issues, such as Dementia or Alzheimer's as well. Some indicators such as falls on the last 6 mos, the increasing need for others to assist with activities of daily living, increased weakness or fatigue, Loss of desire in participating in life activities, increased meds for pain, noticeable weight loss without trying, shortness of breath, even at rest, more frequent hospital ER or physician visits, physician suggestion that illness is life limiting. 4-10 affirmative answers may indicate the need for a referral.

Second, there is a "scam" going around whereby you receive an e-mail or message that the UPS or post office or other delivery service is holding a package for you because of fees or postage due. You are asked for a credit card number, or to provide some kind of personal information in order to free the item for delivery. The USPS or UPS do not operate that way. You can go to the post office to verify or local UPS, NEVER SEND MONEY To someone you have not contacted first.

Lastly, let us all wish Jim and Barb Austin a happy wedding anniversary. I neglected to do so at the luncheon.

Happy St. Valentines Day to the Superstition Mountain Chapter.

As you know, a new continuing resolution was passed funding the government until March 1 or 8, 2024. Let us hope they complete the budgetary process soon. Congress should be working on 2025 at this point, not still cleaning up 2024.

At the Federal level, MOAA has been actively engaged in the 2024 NDAA which passed last month, and I covered the big items of that legislation in the January update. But to try to explain the difference between an authorization and a budget is important. The NDAA is merely the agency authorization to exist, its programs, end strength, and short-term vision. The appropriation is the budgetary allocation to fund those programs and projects. They are not the same. So, while we have an authorization, we do not necessarily have the requisite funding to carry it out. Clear as mud?

MOAA is asking for your help on a number of issues like the budget, spouse support, housing, etc. Here is how you can assist:

The Budget Mess Still Threatens Servicemember Pay Congress Must Act.

- Ask Lawmakers to Pass a Budget
- Urge Your Elected Officials to Pay Servicemembers During a Shutdown

Other Support Services are Lifelines for Caregivers and Veterans.

- Urge Your Legislators to Support the CARE Act
- Urge Your Legislators to Support H.R. 542 and Provisions in S. 141
- Urge Your Legislators to Support H.R. 1815 and S.495

The Major Richard Star Act:

• Ask lawmakers to include H.R. 1282/S. 344 in their official FY 2025 NDAA request.

BAH Restoration Act:

• Ask your elected officials to restore the Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) with H.R. 2537/S. 1823 in their NDAA request.

Arlington National Cemetery (ANC) Burial:

• Congress must act through the NDAA. Please log in to the MOAA |Legislative Action Center (quorum.us)

State Issues The state legislature is now in session. Going through the 635 bills pending today, I found that very little is being discussed impacting those still serving, veterans, and spouses, but I am sure something will be very shortly. This is probably the last time during the state session this year where you can get a bill under consideration. If there is something you feel needs to be addressed, do not delay one more minute. Pick up the phone and call your legislator. Otherwise, we can only weigh in on what has been proposed. Remember, only you can speak for you.

Greetings all,

January was a productive month for Mike Ostermeyer and I for activities in our JROTC support program. We sent out letters to all our schools and as you will see on the attached chart, we have received early feedback from a number of them. There are two changes for our program for this year and they are outlined below.

- As shown in an earlier newsletter, the Chapter made the decision to drop the US Flag award based on feedback from the schools' senior instructors. We decided to replace the flag award with an award of the MOAA Challenge Coin. The MOAA Challenge Coin represents a JROTC cadet who has demonstrated he or she has learned the kind of self-discipline, self-confidence, and leadership skills that can help him or her successfully meet the challenges of adulthood and serve their nation and community. The selection of the recipient will be made by the senior JROTC instructor. So far, we have received positive feedback from the JROTC cadre.
- The second change is the transfer of four of our schools to a new MOAA chapter. The new MOAA chapter has been chartered in north Tucson, the Catalina Mountain Chapter. The Catalina Mountain Chapter has formed a JROTC support program, and they contacted our chapter with a proposal to jump start their program by having Superstition Mountain transfer JROTC support of four schools to their chapter. These four schools are geographically closer to the Catalina Mountain Chapter as compared to our Mesa/East Valley location. After board meetings and approvals by both the Catalina Mountain Chapter and the Superstation Mountain Chapter we agreed to transfer the following JROTC programs to them: Casa Grande HS, Vista Grande HS, Coolidge HS, and Poston Butte HS. Our agreement is that the Superstition Mountain Chapter will provide awards this school year with the Catalina Mountain Chapter picking up the program for next year. CAPT Ritt Schiano will be the POC for the Catalina Mountain Chapter and he, along with a member of our chapter, will be making the awards to these four schools this year on behalf of the Superstition Mountain Chapter.

If you are interested in sponsoring a JROTC award or in presenting chapter awards at the schools' ceremonies, please let me know. Sponsorships are \$100 per school, which covers the cost of the Impact Award. If you have never presented awards in the past this is a great opportunity to see how the JROTC program can positively affect our future leaders. 
