I hope everyone enjoyed the "comfortable" weather in most of May because we are now into the triple digit temps for the summer. Your Board of Directors was able to meet in person for the first time since November. It was great to see everyone and discuss the chapter activities going forward.

I had an opportunity to sit in on virtual meetings with Congressman Stanton and the veteran's affairs staffer for Congressman Biggs to discuss the hot topics and legislation that MOAA deems significant for veterans this year. Additionally, I was present for a virtual meeting with State Sen Gowan, the sponsor of SB1331. This is the bill that would exempt 100 percent of military retirement pay from state income tax. Even though the bill was not heard in the House, Sen Gowan stated it is in the Senate version of the Budget for next year

Legislative Robert Grierson



Memorial Day greetings to the Superstition Mountain Chapter. I'm your new Legislative Liaison for this Chapter. I've done this sort of work over the past dozen years or so on airport issues, but now that I've retired, I will be focused on issues which impact us in the military family. My approach will be to provide you with timely information and solicit your help in reaching out to our legislators when warranted. Sometimes, the timeliness of the issue may require our outreach as an email separate from our monthly newsletter as we asked for your help with SB 1331 last week. On the federal level, you should be aware of a change in terminology from MOAA. What had been called "Storming the Hill," is now called "Advocacy in Action." Hopefully the rationale for this change is apparent following the January 6th incident at the Capitol.

State Legislation

HB2900/SB1828 omnibus; taxation

As permanent law, provides a full individual income tax exemption for benefits, annuities, and pensions received by military retirees, beginning in TY 2021. The current exemption is \$3,500.

Major Actions: 24 May 2021- First Read and assigned to the House Appropriations and Rules Committees and Senate Appropriations and Rules Committees, respectively. Scheduled to be heard in the House Appropriations Committee and Senate Appropriations Committee on 25 May 2021, respectively.

Action Needed - To help ensure this provision remains in the budget, members of the House and Senate need to hear from you. Chapter members should **first** call their state Senator and Representatives and respectfully ask for Legislative support of full exemption of military retired pay from state taxes. **Secondly**, email your Legislators, personalize the proposed message below and send to your state Senator and two Representatives.

SB 1331 - AZ House and Senate versions of the FY 2022 state budget are in the final stages of negotiations. Currently included are the provision of Sen David Gowan's bill, SB1331, calling for full tax exemption of military retired pay.

Action Needed - To help ensure this provision remains in the budget, members of the House and Senate need to hear from you. Chapter members should **first** call their state Senator and Representatives and respectfully ask for Legislative support of full exemption of military retired pay from state taxes. **Secondly**, email your Legislators, personalize the proposed message below and send to your state Senator and two Representatives.

SB 1260 – AZ property tax exemptions; statutory conformity exempts, from property tax, the property of veterans with service or nonservice-connected disabilities who are Arizona residents. It also updates the exemption amount for widows, widowers, persons with a disability and veterans with a service or nonservice-connected disability to reflect the present-day amount of \$4,117, to be increased based on the average annual percentage increase in the Gross Domestic Product price deflator.

Action Needed – Like with SB 1331 and SB 1828, this would be beneficial to many former service-members dealing with a disability.

HB 2706 – AZ veterans' services; benefits counselors Appropriates \$948,400 from the State General Fund in FY 22 to the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services to hire additional benefits counselors. The state agency is currently short 12 benefit counselors. This is causing a backlog and delay of benefits.

Federal Legislation

First Advocacy Item: Free Health Care for All Troops is Key Priority, 4-Star Tells Congress. A MOAA-supported benefit expansion headlined a recent Senate hearing.

No action required.

Second Advocacy Item: Momentum builds toward Tricare Young Adult coverage fix. Healthcare coverage of dependents and young adults under Tricare ends at 21 or 23 if enrolled in school fulltime. To provide coverage costs upwards of \$3,000 per year per child. Join MOAA's work to close this unfair coverage gap. Here's how you can contact your lawmaker today.

THIRD ADVOCACY ITEM: Have you struggled to get your retirement pay? MOAA is seeking feedback from National Guard and Reserve retirees on your experience **No action required.**

FOURTH ADVOCACY ITEM: Comprehensive Toxic Exposure Reform Legislation Taking Shape in Congress. Support for HR 2436 and HR 2127. Whether its Agent Orange, Gulf war Syndrome, Burn Pits, or K2, our troops are not getting their illnesses addressed by the VA. These bills remove the burden of proof of exposure from the servicemember. MOAA's work continues on the Hill and via grassroots advocacy. Take action now to keep the momentum strong.

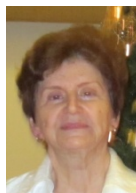
We have been asked for regular sized items as the veterans are only allowed to receive one kit a month.

Getting to Know Your Board Members



A Biography of COL Robert Grierson, USA Retired



Robert Andrew Grierson was born in November 1959 in Chicago, IL and spent his formative years in Elmhurst, IL enlisting in 1978. Following four years of service with the U.S. Navy and U.S. Navy Reserve as an Aircrewman on C-118 transports, Petty Officer Grierson transferred to the Illinois Army National Guard and served in the 2/129 Infantry as a Squad Leader rising to Staff Sergeant before entering Officer Candidate School. In 1984, he received his commission as a Second Lieutenant in the Infantry Branch and was assigned as an Infantry Platoon Leader. Ten months later, he was offered the opportunity to enter Army Helicopter Pilot training and attend

the newly formed Aviation Officer Basic Course at Fort Rucker, Alabama.

Upon completion of Flight Training and subsequent assignment as Operations Officer, 2LT Grierson attended graduate school full time at Northern Illinois University, earning his Master's Degree in Public Administration. Maintaining proficiency in both the UH-1H and the OH-58A, 1LT Grierson transferred to the USAR to become Executive Officer of B Co 2/228 AV RGT and within months was assigned as the Commander of HHC, 244th Theater Aviation Group. During this time frame, he accepted a position with the City of Chicago managing the budgets for O'Hare, Midway, and Meigs Airports, married Ms. Dawn Zeugner, and attended the Aviation Officer Advanced Course, the Aviation Safety Officer Course, the OH-58 Instructor Pilot Course, and the Combined Arms and Services Staff School. All this while taking his command from C5 to C1 and passing the 1st US Army Operational Readiness Evaluation with a go in all 7 areas.

In 1995, accepting a civilian position in California prompted relocation to Fresno where CPT Grierson was fortunate to be accepted into the S-3 Air position in the 40th Aviation Brigade, CA ARNG. Within 18 months he was acting S-3 for the Brigade and promoted to Major and reassigned as S3 and acting XO of the 1/140 AV RGT to stand up a new Battalion and take it to NTC that summer. The CAARNG provided follow on assignments as BN XO, State Aviation Safety Officer, Airfield Commander, State Operations Officer, and Branch Chief for Aviation Standardization. LTC Grierson was mobilized for multiple fires, and floods to include 52 days for hurricanes Katrina and Rita where he was in charge of the mobilized 748 Soldiers from the CAARNG's Army Division.

A 2006 civilian job relocation to Iowa did not provide many TPU opportunities, so after discussions with Army HRC, he elected to accept an administrative reduction in rank to CW2 and take a line pilot position in the IA ARNG. Two years later an LTC assignment was offered, and he was restored to O5 and assumed the duties as Adjutant with the U.S. Army Facility Engineer Command and was then deployed to OEF as the Deputy Chief of Staff and Chief Engineer for Northern Afghanistan. It was during this tour that he cut \$135 million in wasteful projects and built 6 FOBs and COPs for US Forces. Upon his return from OEF, he was assigned at the Chief of Internal Review for the 416th Theater Engineer Command and his section was recognized in 2011 with the USARC Award of Excellence for high quality of work and performance. In April 2012, he accepted command of the 2218 USAR Mobilization Support Battalion at Fort Riley, KS. In 2013 he was selected for promotion to Colonel. In April 2015 following three years of highly successful battalion command, COL Grierson was assigned to the 85th ARSC as the G3/7 just in time for Operation Bold Shift and realignment under 1st US Army. COL Grierson retired in January 2017 with more than 38 years of service credited.

COL Grierson's awards include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2 OLC), Army Commendation Medal (1 OLC), Army Achievement Medal (5 OLC), OEF Medal with Campaign star, Master Aviator Badge, U.S. Navy Reserve Meritorious Service Medal, NATO medal, and numerous longevity and mobilization awards. He is a graduate of the Command and General Staff College, U.S. Army Safety Officer Advanced Course, the Internal Review Basic and Advanced Courses, and the Joint Engineering Operations Course. He holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Public Administration and is an Accredited Airport Executive with the American Association of Airport Executives.

COL Grierson and his wife Dawn reside in Queen Creek and until recently Dubuque, IA and they have two sons, Connor and Trenton. He is recently retired as the Airport Director for the Dubuque Regional Airport. He is the past President of the Iowa Public Airports Association, served on the Board of Directors for the Chamber of Commerce of Greater Dubuque, as well as the Dubuque Area Convention and Visitor's Bureau, and taught Airport Planning and Management as an Adjunct Faculty Member at the University of Dubuque.
