Personal Afffairs Greg Moore



Greetings,

Some of you in the past may have been reluctant or unwilling to admit misplacing your wallet while on vacation in, say Santa Fe because of the hassle of replacing your driver's license, Military ID, credit cards etc. As your Personal Affairs Officer, I am here to help and share your pain!

AZ Driver's License: Can be replaced online if you know your DL # (which is on the license you lost.) Solution, take a picture or make a copy of your license. Otherwise, be prepared to spend 63 minutes standing in line at the Tempe Beck office of the AZ DOT. This assumes they are fully staffed that day, and everyone is in good humor and not in training (State employees.)

Retiree military ID: AZ National Guard 48th/McDowell SE corner You must have 2 forms of government ID including passport or Driver's License (which you have misplaced) VA Health card (which you have misplaced with your wallet.) New cards resemble a credit card. For dependent cards, other ID is needed, I would call first.

Credit Cards: a call to customer service or bank branch visit will do. Numbers will be changed so be sure to contact those who auto bill your card like Amazon, landscaper, newspaper etc.

Vaccination Cards: If you have lost your vaccination card and got your shots at the VA, the nurse in the lobby will be able to call up your record and issue a new shot card on the spot and a new ID card is available on the second floor in Registration.

Social Security and Medicare cards: can be replaced online. There is a charge for a new Social Security card which is payable using a credit card (that you just lost).

From personal experience, make sure to check that sofa you might have sat on when at the relatives while on vacation.

Please get vaccinated, wash your hands often, keep safe distancing and keep those military still in Afghanistan in your prayers.

Labor Day greetings Superstition Mountain chapter. Like many of you, I'm still reeling from the loss of 13

Marines and Naval corpsman in Afghanistan

following what appears to be a failed withdrawal plan. As of drafting this section, we still have close to a week before our withdrawal timetable becomes final, so our casualty numbers may continue to grow.

Congress has entered their August recess with minimal activity. But your MOAA team continues their push for critical items. While the legislators are out and about, their staffs are still answering phones and focused on policy.

Here are some of the items MOAA is focused on:

FIRST ADVOCACY ITEM: MOAA Members Share Their TRICARE Pharmacy Challenges. We asked for your input, and you responded. No action required.

SECOND ADVOCACY ITEM: MOAA: 'Keep Promises Made in Afghanistan. Veterans' groups joined dozens of lawmakers to send a simple message: Leave no one behind. No action required.

THIRD ADVOCACY ITEM: August Recess Is No Time to Take a Break on Concurrent Receipt. Urge your lawmakers to make the much-needed reforms included in the Major Richard Starr Act part of the NDAA.

- <u>Click on TAKE ACTION: Ask Your</u> <u>Lawmakers to Support the Major</u> <u>Richard Star Act</u>
- Fill in your personal information and Zip Code. Enter "PREVIEW MESSAGE" to see the draft message to be sent to your three Federal Legislators. Your message can be edited or changed if desired.
- Be sure that your Zip Code is entered as it determines which legislators will receive your emails.
- Click "SUBMIT" to send your message.

- FOURTH ADVOCACY ITEM: Retirees and Disabled Veterans Due for Record Raise Next Year. Find out what the latest Cost of Living Adjustment figures could mean to you. <u>No action required.</u>
- FIFTH ADVOCACY ITEM: Reserve Component Benefits Are at Risk. Ask Your House Member to Act Now. After a historically busy year, incentive pay parity is critical to retention. Join MOAA's efforts today.
- Click on [RELATED: Ask Your House Member to Support Incentive Pay Parity]
- Fill in your personal information and Zip Code.
- Enter "PREVIEW MESSAGE" to see the draft message to be sent to your three Federal Legislators. Your message can be edited or changed if desired.
- Be sure that your Zip Code is entered as it determines which legislators will receive your emails.
- Click "SUBMIT" to send your message.

 - SIXTH ADVOCACY ITEM: MOAA Supports Legislation Providing Better Benefits for New Military Parents. The bills address issues surrounding leave, parental health, and other retention concerns. No action required.
