Legislative Robert Grierson



December greetings to the Superstition Mountain Chapter. At the time of drafting this update, NDAA is still being

tossed around in Washington. As I have mentioned over the past several months, there are some contentious issues which must be addressed in the Senate. But there are also some important components of the pending legislation that I'll highlight below:

MOAA has identified several key legislative goals which I will discuss below.

Passed the House: A key step in the FY 2022 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) process came in Sept when the House voted 316-113 to pass its version of the bill. Now it's up to the Senate to take action.

- 1. Pay raise A 2.7% pay raise is included in both House and Senate bills although this raise does not keep up with inflation.
- 2. Basic Needs Allowance Provisions from the Military Hunger Prevention Act are included in both versions of the NDAA this year and

- will authorize a new allowance for families that fall within a band of the poverty line.
- Military spouse employment The House and Senate both address this topic but propose different methods of resolving the problem. A conference committee will have to address the differences.
- 4. Guard and reserve pay parity Like the House version, the Senate includes a fix for incentive pay parity with the reserve component. MOAA has long pushed for this effort and applauds both chambers for including provisions to support reservists and the National Guard.
- Arlington National Cemetery DoD may soon publish eligibility changes for ANC that would dramatically reduce the benefit of those currently eligible and for future servicemembers. The draft rule may still be published this fall.
- 6. Selective service NDAA language in the House and Senate indicates selective service will grow to include women this year.

Last week, I attended the MOAA the Southwest Leaders Workshop in San Diego. The focus was on legislation action, recruitment, and surviving spouse issues. Here are some key take-a-ways from the two day session (excuse my cryptic notes):

- 1. Average age of a MOAA member is 72 and increasing.
- 2. Life members average 78 years old, premium members' 72 years old, basic members 50 years old.
- 3. We are having a downward trend in life membership
- 4. Need outreach to active officers
- 5. All chapters should maximize their use of social media, not just a website.
- 6. Our region will have 2 national MOAA board seats coming open next year
- 7. Chapter newsletters: content must avoid partisan positions and talking points. MOAA welcomes all party positions.
- 8. Involve and engage the families of prospective members.
- 9. MOAA store reopening in next 2 weeks.
- 10. Working the Starr act. Pushing for passage this year.

- 11. Need comprehensive toxic exposure reform, CBO is scoring very high costs to address. Will require grassroots efforts to fix.
- 12. The advocacy in action program has adapted during the pandemic. It's been effective in outreach.
- 13. Tricare young adult coverage may not happen this year.
- 14. Hearing talk about cutting military and benefits. Will need pushback at the local level.
- 15. Next Advocacy in Action is programmed for April 25-28 on Capitol Hill
- 16. Annual membership meeting October 28-29, 2022 in Kansas City

Current Federal issues

FIRST ADVOCACY ITEM: The Benefit Under Threat: Saving TRICARE For Life. TFL turned 20 in October, but its future is far from certain.

No specific action required.

SECOND ADVOCACY ITEM: Senate NDAA Amendment Seeks to Ease Financial Challenges for New Survivors. Ask your lawmakers to support Military Retiree Survivor Comfort Act at this critical stage.

Click on **TAKE ACTION**: Ask Your Lawmaker to Support the Military Retiree Survivor Comfort Act. Fill in your personal information and Zip Code.

THIRD ADVOCACY ITEM: NDAA May Include TRICARE Young Adult Coverage Fix. This MOAA-backed measure helps ensure your health benefit matches private-sector plans. Contact your lawmakers today.

Click on TAKE ACTION: Urge Your Elected Officials to Fix the TRICARE Young Adult Coverage Gap. Fill in your personal information and Zip Code.

Current State issues

I haven't heard much about any contentious issues arising just yet other than the property tax exemption efforts for Veterans. That's one of the issues that has been brought up in legislation form the last few Sessions but did not get across the finish line during the most recent Session. If you take a look at the End of Session-Legislative Update (https://dvs.az.gov/legislative-updates), there are

quite a few bills that died in the process that I anticipate seeing again.


