Greetings all!

I am sorry that I was not able to be with you for the Membership luncheon. I had another commitment, but I will attend this month. I hope that everyone had a great time.

I was notified that we have again received the Four-Star Level of Excellence Award. Unfortunately, I will not be able to attend the MOAA meeting at the end of October to receive the award in person. I will receive it during the Council of Chapters meeting in November.

According to the MOAA Newsletter, the standard Part B monthly premium will drop to \$164,90 next year, which is down from \$170.for the first time since 2011-12. Beneficiaries will pay less in a new year. Due to the law passed on August 10<sup>th</sup>, thousands of veterans who served after the 1991 Persian Gulf War, or against a hostile force after November 11, 1998, or were discharged or released for active duty from September 11, 2001 to October 1, 2013, are now eligible for VA Health benefits. There is a wealth of information in the weekly MOAA Newsletter. If you are not signed up to receive it via e-mail, I would suggest that you log in to the MOAA website and select to receive it.

I look forward to seeing you at the next meeting. Stay safe and healthy.

Fall greetings to the Superstition Mountain Chapter. Just like last year, at the time of drafting this update, NDAA is being tossed around in Washington. So far, not one of the twelve required funding

bills has cleared congress. I learned a little tidbit today that I must share. The last time the House of Representatives passed all 12 funding bills before the September 30 end of Federal Fiscal Year was in 1997. A quarter century of government shutdowns, continuing resolutions, and short-term budgetary fixes. This falls on both republicans and democrats. We must do better.

For some good news, a few months ago, I reported the PACT act was approved and signed into law, but so far, that seems like it for the legislative process. A number of other important bills continue to languish in spite of their support and number of co-sponsors.

MOAA has identified a number of key legislative goals for this congress of which they are asking for your support by contacting your representative or senator. I'll outline below.

#### Federal Legislation supported by MOAA

Urge Your Legislators to Support Concurrent Receipt - Contact your representative and senators and urge them to support The Major Richard Star Act, which would provide concurrent receipt for servicemembers unable to complete 20 years of service due to combat-related injuries. Help ensure these men and women get their full service-earned retirement, as well as their disability compensation from the VA.

Urge Your Legislators to Ensure Uniformed Services Pay Keeps Up With Inflation Let your lawmakers know they must preserve the value of military compensation in the FY 2023 National Defense Authorization Act or risk the readiness and stability of the all-volunteer force

Help Support Military Family Access to Mental Health Care

Help MOAA build support for H.R. 4824, the Stop Copay Overpay Act, which would reduce TRICARE copays for mental health visits and address the financial barrier to accessing mental health services.

Urge Your Senators to Support Legislation Halting Cuts to Military Medicine Please contact your senators and urge them to support H.R. 7900 Sec. 780, which would halt medical billet cuts for three years and increase congressional oversight and DoD reporting.

Call Your Elected Officials and Urge Them to Support Concurrent Receipt

Call your representative and senators and urge them to support the Major Richard Star Act, which would provide concurrent receipt for servicemembers unable to complete 20 years of service due to combat-related injuries. Help ensure these men and women get their full service-earned retirement as well as their disability compensation from the VA.

Urge Your Senators to Protect Pay and Benefits in the FY 2023 NDAA On July 14, the U.S. House of Representatives passed their chamber's version of the FY 2023 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) by a vote of 329-101. Now, it is time for the Senate to take up its version of the NDAA and pass it out of their chamber so the bill can continue to make its way through the legislative process.

Urge Your Elected Officials to Fix the TRICARE Young Adult Coverage Gap

MOAA continues efforts to build support for The Health Care Fairness for Military Families Act of 2021. These bipartisan and bicameral pieces of legislation would expand TRICARE eligibility to young adult dependents up to age 26, bringing TRICARE in line with commercial plan requirements.

Ask Your Lawmakers to Support the Military Hunger Prevention Act

Food insecurity among junior servicemembers is not a new concern, but like many ongoing problems, it's been made worse by the economic fallout from the COVID-19 pandemic. The Military Hunger Prevention Act would establish a Basic Needs Allowance (BNA) for these servicemembers, helping them overcome financial difficulties and allowing them to concentrate on their duties.

Ask Your House Member to Adjust SGLI and VGLI for Inflation With the Supporting Families of the Fallen Act Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI) and Veterans' Group Life Insurance (VGLI) coverage amounts have not been updated since 2005. This law would raise the level from \$400,000 to \$500,000 – a necessary move to preserve the value of this program in the face inflation.

Ask Your Lawmakers to Support the Expanding America's National Cemetery Act Help MOAA stay in the middle of this important conversation – Contact your elected officials and urge them to support the Expanding America's National Cemetery Act.

Urge Your Senators to Support Legislation to Repeal the TRICARE Select Enrollment Fee Act now to urge your senators to support the TRICARE Select Restoration Act, which is an important first step to repeal the enrollment fee for grandfathered retirees.

Urge Congress to Expand TRICARE Coverage to Certain 'Gray Area' Retirees

The TRICARE Fairness for National Guard and Reserve Retirees Act would ensure these "gray area" retirees who qualify for retirement pay before age 60 are eligible for the TRICARE retiree benefit. Under current law, gray area retirees who want TRICARE coverage must purchase TRICARE Retired Reserve (TRR), an expensive premium-based plan, even if they are receiving retired pay.

Support Health Care for Children of Disabled Veterans or Veterans Who Have Died Due to a Service-Connected Disability The CHAMPVA Children's Care Protection Act would expand coverage under the VA program for children of eligible veterans so they can have health care until age 26, as afforded to most Americans through private and federal policies.

Urge Your Legislators to Support the Military Spouse Hiring Act

Contact your representative and senators and urge them to support the Military Spouse Hiring Act, which would incentivize businesses to hire military spouses.

Support the Elizabeth Dole Home and Community Based Services for Veterans and Caregivers Act Contact your representatives and senators and urge them to support H.R. 6823 and S. 3854, the Elizabeth Dole Home and Community Based Services for Veterans and Caregivers Act, which would improve VA home and community-based services to care and support for veterans and their caregivers.

Ask Your Lawmakers to Fully Fund the Government on Time

We need everyone to contact their representative and senators and urge them to work together to fund the government before the Sept. 30 deadline.

Protect the All-Volunteer Force and Personnel Strength in the NDAA Ask Congress to keep up our personnel strength so our troops can safely do their job.

Urge Your House Member to Support the Military Spouse Jobs Continuity Act The Military Spouse Jobs Continuity Act calls on DoD to make the license reimbursement program permanent.

Urge Your House Member to Support Dental Coverage for the Reserve Component The Dental Care for Our Troops Act would provide zero out-of-pocket cost dental care to reserve component servicemembers.

Urge Your Senators to Support the Military Spouse Employment Act The Military Spouse Employment Act ensures federal agencies can take advantage of the talent, expertise, and quality work military spouses are capable of through direct or remote federal work, regardless of where they are stationed.

Call Your Elected Officials to Support the Expanding America's National Cemetery Act Help MOAA stay in the middle of this important conversation – Call your lawmakers and urge them to support the Expanding America's National Cemetery Act.

Ask Your Lawmakers to Pass the Coast Guard Authorization Act of 2022 The Coast Guard Authorization Act of 2022 contains important provisions which would ensure Coast Guard members are paid in the event of any lapse in appropriations or government shutdown. Contact your legislators today and ask them to co-sponsor this critical piece of legislation.

Urge Your Senators to Support the Military Family Nutrition Access Act The Military Family Nutrition Access Act will exclude BAH from income when determining eligibility for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and ensure military families have access to this benefit.

Share Your Story: Impact of TRICARE Pharmacy Network Changes Will you be impacted when community pharmacies leave the TRICARE network? Please share your story with your representative.

Ask Your Lawmakers to Support the Jobs and Childcare for Military Families Act The military spouse unemployment rate is not a new concern, but like many ongoing problems, it's been made worse by the economic fallout from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ask Your Lawmakers to Support the Retained Skilled Veterans Act This bipartisan legislation would end the so-called "180-day rule," which imposes a waiting period on those leaving service before they can take on certain types of DoD civilian employment. Many of these jobs are empty as qualified applicants with security clearances are forced to look elsewhere to start their careers.

Ask Your Lawmakers to Support the Military Retiree Survivor Comfort Act Financial concerns and stress can be a terrible burden on top of an already stressful situation for a newly widowed spouse. The Military Retiree Survivor Comfort Act (H.R. 2214 and S.1669) will allow survivors to gradually repay the amount over the next 12 months and have an opportunity to request for debt forgiveness through DoD.

Help MOAA Secure Health Care for Servicemembers in the Selected Reserve

The National Guard and Reserve play critical roles in our national defense and emergency response missions. The Healthcare For Our Troops Act would provide medical and dental care for Selected Reserve members at no out-of-pocket cost, bringing their coverage in line with their active-duty counterparts.

#### Act Now to Improve Survivors' Benefits

Bipartisan legislation in the House and Senate (H.R. 3402/S.976) would align Dependency and Indemnity Compensation payments with other federal survivor benefits. Ask your legislators to show their support and make a long-overdue correction to this injustice.

Justice for ALS Veterans

Survivors should not be disadvantaged when an aggressive illness like ALS takes their loved one far too soon. The unique nature of this disease means few veterans survive long enough to receive the enhanced benefits that other totally disabled veterans receive.

Urge Your House Member to Support the BAH Restoration Act

The BAH Restoration Act calls on DoD to restore BAH to full coverage of the monthly cost of adequate housing in the area.

Urge Your House Member to Support the BAH Calculation Improvement Act The BAH Calculation Improvement Act calls on DoD to reevaluate the current calculation of the Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) and provide recommendations for a more flexible, responsive method.

Support Long-Term and Extended Care Services for Veterans

Tell your lawmakers to press forward on MOAA-backed bills to enhance long-term and extended care options for veterans in need: the Elizabeth Dole Home Care Act; the Expanding Veterans' Options for Long-Term Care Act; and the Long-Term Care Veterans Choice Act.


