# **VETERANS DAY, NOV. 11<sup>TH</sup> – REMEMBER**





Election Day greetings to the Superstition Mountain Chapter. With the General Election cycle in full swing in Arizona, there is very little legislation moving at the federal level for me to track. But at the state level, we have something which should interest every disabled Vet, disabled non-Vet, widow, or widower. That's Proposition 130.

The language of the bill itself says very little: "Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Arizona; Repealing article IX, Sections 2, 2.1, 2.2 and 2.3, Constitution of Arizona; amending Article IX, Constitution of Arizona, by adding a new Section 2; relating to property tax exemptions."

However, its impact is something many of us should find very important.

A "YES" vote shall have the effect of amending the constitution to consolidate property tax exemptions into a single section; removing the constitutional determinations as to the amounts of certain property tax exemptions, leaving the legislature to prescribe by law the qualifications for and amounts of property tax exemptions it creates; allowing property tax exemptions for resident veterans with disabilities, widows, and widowers regardless of when they became Arizona residents; and establishing that a person is not eligible for property tax exemption as a widow, widower, person with a disability, or veteran with a disability.

A "NO" vote shall have the effect of retaining existing law on property tax exemptions.

Background - SCR 1011 was passed In the Arizona State Senate and subsequently went to the House for deliberation. Because it changes the state constitution, an amendment was introduced as Senate Concurrent Resolution 1011 (SCR 1011). On February 9, 2022, the state Senate voted 17 to 12, with one senator not voting, in favor of the measure. On June 22, the House voted 58-0 to approve the measure, with 2 members absent. This passed with bipartisan support. The proposition itself does not have any formalized opposition.

MOAA as an organization has not weighed in on this measure. However, I believe it's important for our membership to consider the pros and cons of this proposition when you cast your ballot.



The First Thanksgiving

The first Thanksgiving at Plymouth was to thank God for a bountiful harvest. It lasted 3 days with recreation. Those who gathered were simply grateful for life. Many of them had died.

Out of 102 original passengers, only 53 survived that first brutal winter, because of the arduous journey across the Atlantic on the "Mayflower" (sometimes at 2 miles per hour), disease and starvation. The new colonists were from cities; they were not farmers. Therefore, only about half of them survived the winter. They would not have survived without the help of the Wampanoag Indians, who shared their food and game. One of them, Squanto, spoke English, and they taught the colonists their planting methods.

### The account of the first Thanksgiving- Edward Winslow, December 1621:

"Our harvest being gotten in, our governor sent four men on fowling, that so we might after a special manner rejoice together, after we had gathered the fruits of our labors; they four in one day killed as much fowl, as with a little help beside, served the company almost a week, at which time amongst other recreations, we exercised our arms, many of the Indians coming amongst us, and amongst the rest their greatest king Massasoit, with some ninety men, whom for three days we entertained and feasted, and they went out and killed five deer, which they brought to the plantation and bestowed on our Governor, and upon the Captain and others. And although it be not always so plentiful, as it was at this time with us, yet by the goodness of God, we are so far from want, that we often wish you partakers of our plenty."
