





Gen. Horatio Gates

The Conspiracy of October 1777

In 1777, the Battle of Saratoga was fought on the fields of upstate New York, nine miles to the south of the town of Saratoga. British General John Burgoyne had arrived from Canada with an army of 7,200 troops at his command. He was attempting to isolate New England from the rest of the colonies as the British had planned, and hoped to dominate New York. However, General Horatio Gates, with his 9,000 soldiers and 2,000 arriving later, met Burgoyne in New York to oppose him.

There were two encounters during the Battle of Saratoga. The first was when Gen. Burgoyne attacked the entrenched Patriots at Freeman's Farm on September 19th. They managed to overrun the Americans, killing almost 600. However, Burgoyne suffered twice the American losses. Having waited as long as he could for reinforcements, Burgoyne attacked again on October 7th. This time the Americans defeated Burgoyne's army and regained lost ground. Dispirited and defeated, Burgoyne and his men marched to Saratoga and entrenched themselves. Within two weeks, Gates' army surrounded them and forced a surrender. The great victory secured for the revolution the aid of the French, as well as the Spanish and the Dutch, who were delighted for an opportunity to weaken their British rival.

General Horatio Gates became very popular because of his success in the defeat of General Burgoyne and his army. Soon his friends began to say that he was more qualified to lead the Continental Army than General George Washington. The "Conway Cabal" conspiracy began when General Thomas Conway praised Gates for saving the Revolution, thus disparaging Washington. His words were, "Heaven has been determined to save your Country; or a weak General and bad Counsellors would have ruined it." Only the drunken words of an officer, Colonel James Wilkinson, prematurely revealed the plot. With strong backing from important men in the Army and Congress, Washington was able to stop the conspiracy and maintain his command. He went on to force a surrender by British General Cornwallis in Yorktown in 1781.

General Gates offered his apologies to General Washington. Perhaps Gates could have benefitted from the old adage which cautions to beware when all men are speaking well of you. Fortunately, his pride was all that was lost.

Legislative

Fall Greetings to the Superstition Mountain Chapter.

Just a quick note, I will be out up through December without access to most US legislative info. So, I invite you to use the links here to stay abreast of most legislative action. National bills supported by MOAA <https://moaa.quorum.us/bills> and State of Arizona legislation <https://dvs.az.gov/about/legislative-updates> Did you know that MOAA has a series of video updates on legislation free to its members? Take a look at what is available for you. https://www.youtube.com/playlist?list=PLZJJ2z1-x_q3tfOALHMIKAR_pVTjEhk86 Currently, the Arizona State Legislature is in recess and US Congress are back in DC. So, at the state level, there's very little activity to report. However, the state has a new Department of Veterans Services Director. His name is John Scott, and he served in the USMC as an NCO. His bio can be found at <https://dvs.az.gov/about/leadership/john-scott> As I mentioned last month, MOAA asks that you take the opportunity to seek action on a number of bills currently stalled in Congress. You have seen these before in previous updates, but this request comes from MOAA National.

- Junior Enlisted Pay Raise: Competitive pay remains critical to the health of the all-volunteer force, and both the House and the Senate seek to address this issue in the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). The House NDAA calls for servicemembers E-1 to E-4 to receive a 15% pay raise beyond the 4.5% earmarked for all in uniform. While the Senate version calls for an additional 1% increase for servicemembers E-1 to E-3 (beyond the 4.5% raise).
- Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH) Restoration: Access to quality housing and promoting financial wellness is important to sustaining the all-volunteer force. Restoring BAH addresses both issues. The House version of the NDAA would restore BAH to 100% for FY 2025 – a move toward MOAA's goal of full repeal of the BAH reduction, but not a permanent fix. Unfortunately, the Senate version does not address the issue.
- Major Richard Star Act: Tens of thousands of combat-injured veterans lose a dollar of earned DoD retirement pay for every dollar of VA disability compensation. For three years in a row, over two-thirds of Congress has supported the Star Act, which would end that unjust financial offset. Despite this vast support, neither version of the NDAA includes the bill. However, it is critical lawmakers continue to hear about this important issue, especially as we approach the start of the 119th Congress.

How important is your involvement? Last week the Department of Veterans Affairs nearly defaulted on payments to disabled Veterans. Groups like MOAA ensured that did not happen, but the fix was only a 3 month continuing resolution. So, we have another fight looming after the election.
